 the Agency requires coverage prior to approval by SDRMA's Board of Directors, the SDRMA underwriters are
 authorized to issue a 60-day conditional binder).
- Initial three-program year member enrollment required. Upon meeting the initial three-program year commitment, a member may withdraw by submitting a 90-day (April 1) intent to withdraw letter before the annual renewal.
- Maintaining annual Membership in California Special Districts Association is required and separate from this quotation.
- Special District Risk Management Authority's Credit Incentive Program (CIP) awards up to 15% off the annual contribution for completion of approved risk management and training programs. Members can reduce future contributions each year by earning CIP points or not experiencing any paid claims.

Upon receipt of all membership documents, SDRMA will issue the policy and forward pro-rated invoices for the annualized Property/Liability Program contributions.

We look forward to Interagency Communications Interoperability System Authority's participation in the SDRMA Property/Liability Program. General Conditions:

Final coverage and terms are subject to change based on final program terms and SDRMA Board approval. More detailed information can be found on your 2021/2022 SDRMA Coverage Agreement and final coverage document terms will prevail.

Additional Changes to property or vehicle values or payroll made mid-term will incur additional premium mid-term.

Non-member certificates of coverage issued mid-term will be billed mid-term

Non-member certificates of coverage will be \$50 per certificate regardless of the length of time for the certificate.

Waiver of subrogations requested on non-member certificates of coverage are granted on a case by case basis after review of full agreement by carrier and subject to charge as noted above.

If member passes board resolution to cover volunteer positions and board members under Workers' Compensation, they can be covered if exposure is reported and board resolution provided to SDRMA. These positions will be charged a premium and exposure will be included as part of audit. Members should track volunteer hours for reporting purposes.

Maintain annual membership in CSDA. CSDA FEE is not included in SDRMA Premium. This fee will be billed directly to your organization by CSDA.

3 Year Commitment (Member may withdraw from SDRMA after 3 years provided they give SDRMA 90 days' notice by April 1, 2022 of their intent to withdraw before policy expires on July 1, 2022.)

Membership documents (Executed JPA Agreement, Resolution, etc.) approved by governing body are required before coverage can be bound.

Liability Package Prospects Conditions:

Subject to verification and final underwriting review

Adoption of a Resolution by the Member's Board of Directors approving the form and authorizing the Execution of the Sixth Amended Joint Powers Agreement and agreeing to membership in the SDRMA Property/Liability Package Program for an initial 3-year commitment.

Execution and delivery of the Sixth Amended Joint Powers Agreement of SDRMA.

Updated No Known Loss letter

Completion of the Alliant Crime Policy application. Including Copy of Internal Controls.

Approval by SDRMA's Board of Directors of Member's membership in the Property/Liability program. (In the event Member requires coverage prior to approval by SDRMA's Board of Directors, the SDRMA CEO is authorized to issue a 60 day conditional binder).

Annual Membership in California Special Districts Association is required and separate from this quotation. Per the CSDA application the dues will be \$1,556. In addition to the premium above.

Upon receipt of all membership documents, SDRMA will forward an invoice for the Property/Liability package program contribution.

Executed membership documents must be received prior to effective date.



RESOLUTION NO. 22-2

A RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNANCE BOARD OF THE INTERAGENCY COMMUNICATIONS INTEROPERBILITY SYSTEM JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY APPROVING THE FORM OF AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A SIXTH AMENDED JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT OF THE SPECIAL DISTRICT RISK MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY AND AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE SPECIAL DISTRICT RISK MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY'S PROPERTY/LIABILITY PROGRAM

WHEREAS, The Interagency Communications Interoperability System (ICI System), a special district duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of California (the "Agency"), has determined that it is in the best interest and to the advantage of the Agency to participate for at least three full years in the Property/Liability Program offered by the Special District Risk Management Authority (the "Authority"); and

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 6500 *et seq.*, provides that two or more public agencies may by agreement jointly exercise any power common to the contracting parties; and

WHEREAS, Special District Risk Management Authority was formed in 1986 in accordance with the provisions of California Government Code 6500 *et seq.*, for the purpose of providing its members with risk financing and risk management programs; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 990.4 provides that a local public entity may self-insure, purchase insurance through an authorized carrier, or purchase insurance through a surplus lines broker, or any combination of these; and

WHEREAS, participation in Special District Risk Management Authority programs requires the Agency to execute and enter into a Sixth Amended Joint Powers Agreement (the "Amended JPA Agreement"); which states the purpose and powers of the Authority; and

WHEREAS, all acts, conditions and things required by the laws of the State of California to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in connection with the consummation of the transactions authorized hereby do exist, have happened and have been performed in regular and due time, form and manner as required by law, and the Agency is now duly authorized and empowered, pursuant to each and every requirement of law, to consummate such transactions for the purpose, in the manner and upon the terms herein provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNANCE BOARD OF THE AGENCY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Findings</u>. The Agency Governance Board hereby specifically finds and determines that the actions authorized hereby relate to the public affairs of the Agency.

Section 2. <u>Sixth Amended JPA Agreement</u>. The Amended JPA Agreement proposed to be executed and entered into by and between the Agency and members of the Special District Risk Management Authority, in the form presented at this meeting and on file with the Agency Secretary, is hereby

approved. The Agency Governance Board and/or Authorized Officers ("The Authorized Officers") are hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the Agency, to execute and deliver to the Authority the Amended JPA Agreement in substantially said form, with such changes therein as such officers may require or approve, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

Section 3. <u>Program Participation</u>. The Agency Governance Board approves participating for three full program years in Special District Risk Management Authority Property and Liability Program.

Section 4. Other Actions. The Authorized Officers of the Agency are each hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all documents which is necessary in order to consummate the transactions authorized hereby and all such actions heretofore taken by such officers are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.

Section 5. <u>Effective Date</u>. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage with Membership in SDRMA and Insurance to be effective July 1, 2022.
